<p>Concurrent Enrollment</p> <p>Concurrent Enrollment is a UVU-High School partnership where students are able to earn college credit. College level classes are taught at the high school using college curriculum and assessment. There is a one-time registration fee of \$35. Each course is \$5 per credit.</p> <p>uvu.edu/concurrent</p>	<p>Advanced Placement (AP)</p> <p>Advanced Placement classes are college level classes available in 9-12 grades. Students receive regular high school credit for taking the class and will need to take the AP test in the spring. If passed, the student receives college credit.</p> <p>apstudent.collegeboard.org</p>	<p>ALC (Advanced Learning Center)</p> <p>The ALC provides early college and career courses to Nebo high school students. Students are able to stay enrolled at their primary high school while also attending classes at the ALC in Salem.</p> <p>alc.nebo.edu</p>
<p>Mountainland Technology College (MTECH)</p> <p>MTECH provides high school students with advanced training programs during school hours. All MTECH training is designed to prepare students for employment. Some programs may transfer to traditional colleges and universities.</p> <p>mtec.edu</p>	<p>Online Courses</p> <p>Students have the option to take selected courses online. This would be great for those times when your schedule just doesn't quite work out, or you just can't get enough education. <p>ACT</p> <p>Most students take the ACT during the spring of their Junior year and/or the fall of their Senior year. It is required for most college admissions and various academic scholarships.</p> <p>actstudent.org</p>	<p>Utah Futures</p> <p>Utah Futures is a great tool to plan ahead and research future career and college opportunities. <p>My529</p> <p>The My 529 plan is a 529 plan that encourages saving for future higher education expenses. To maximize your Regents' Scholarship award, you must deposit \$100 or more when you are 14, 15, 16, and 17.</p> <p>My529.org</p>	<p>Regents' Scholarship</p> <p>The Regents' Scholarship encourages Utah high school students to prepare for college academically and financially by taking a core course of study and saving for college.
